

GUIDELINE FOR POSTER PRESENTATION

1. Title and Authors

- ✓ Ensure that the title is clear and concise, accurately reflecting the main theme of the research.
- ✓ Please include the names of all authors along with their affiliations.

2. Layout

- ✓ Organise the content logically: Introduction, Methods, Results, and Conclusions.
- ✓ Employ headings and subheadings to direct the viewer through the poster.

3. Visual Elements

- ✓ Utilise high-quality graphics, charts, and images to convey information effectively.
- ✓ Ensure the text is sufficiently large to be read from afar.

4. Text

- ✓ Keep the text brief. Utilise bullet points for clarity.
- ✓ Refrain from using long paragraphs.

5. Colour and Design

- ✓ Adopt a cohesive colour scheme that is visually appealing and enhances readability
- ✓ Steer clear of excessively bright or distracting colours.

6. References

- ✓ Include a brief reference section for any significant literature cited in your work.

7. Interactive Component

- ✓ If feasible, incorporate QR codes or links to additional materials for viewers to further explore.

8. Printing

- ✓ Ensure that the poster is printed on an appropriate material for display
- ✓ Verify the dimensions required by the conference.

9. Presentation

- ✓ Please stand beside your poster during the presentation times.
- ✓ Greet your visitors warmly and express enthusiasm for your work.

10. Poster Size

- ✓ A0 (840mm*1890mm)
